Breakfast Club - 9am exam starts only



We have arranged with the College canteen for students to obtain a free breakfast batch or wrap prior to 9am exams. The offer will be either a meat, vegetarian, halal or vegan option. The canteen will be open from around 8am to facilitate this for you and you will need to give them your name as you will have to be marked off the list as being eligible due to sitting an exam that morning at 9am. Accepting UCAS offers:

Please check UCAS track for the deadline to accept your course. The majority of courses, if you applied by the 25th January, have until 18th May to make their offers to you, and then students will have until 8th June to accept their offers.

If you haven't received any offers you can apply through UCAS Extra for individual courses – extra is open until 20th June.

Clearing:

From 5 July – 17 October 2023, you can apply for a course using Clearing if you're not already holding an offer from a university or college, and the course still has places.

You can use Clearing if:

- you're applying after 30 June
- you didn't receive any offers (or none you wanted to accept)
- you didn't meet the conditions of your offers
- you've paid the multiple choice application fee of £27
- you've declined your firm place using the 'decline my place' button in your application.


UPS - Year 1

Esports

KE6 Vanguard competes in the British Student Championships, a national esports league that sees hundreds of schools and colleges across the country competing on a weekly basis.

The annual competition is open to all secondary schools, Further Education (FE) colleges and Alternative Provision (AP) schools in the UK and is PC-based. Each institution can enter multiple teams for four different games: League of Legends (5v5), Overwatch 2 (5v5), Rocket League (3v3), and VALORANT (5v5). The competition has now moved into the Spring Split stage, following the previous Winter Split, where Vanguard placed an average of 3rd in their respective group stages.
