Absences

Please report all absences asap and preferably on the day. You should always report any absences to College Services even if you have advised your teachers. Please do this by telephone, email collegeservices@ke6n.ac.uk or Cedar (parent function).

An email will be sent home each day at 5pm to the student and the first contact on our system for any authorised and unauthorised absences for that day. If you have any query with that email, please contact college services.



Exams

We are in the final stretch of exams in College. Please remember to check when your exam is; date, time, room etc. Individual exam timetables are on Cedar (Cedar should be checked regularly as this has the most up to date seating information) and arrive in plenty of time for your exam.

Important reminder

15th June – Afternoon 28th June – Full day

These dates will be used if a significant, unexpected event arises nationally or locally during the exam period such that no students (or a large number of them) are able to take an exam when planned. Of course, we all hope there won't be such disruption and that the contingency day won't be needed. Therefore, students should be available throughout the exam period, including these dates, in case their planned timetable is disrupted. The contingency date is set by Ofqual and the Joint Council for Qualifications. All students must be available for these dates.

Other dates:

- 3rd-7th July 1st year end of year exams
- 7th July Last day of term.

Be exam ready!

All students should come to college <u>fully equipped</u> for exams. Checking equipment the night before the exam is one of the easiest ways to avoid any last minute worries.

Students are expected to bring the following equipment:

- Pens (must be black ink for exams)
- Pencils
- Rules
- Scientific calculator (if applicable)
- Maths equipment (if applicable)
- College ID
- Pencil cases are not permitted unless they are transparent
- Water bottle which must be transparent.

Breakfast Club – 9am exam starts only



We have arranged with the College canteen for students to obtain a free breakfast batch or wrap prior to 9am exams. The offer will be either a meat, vegetarian, halal or vegan option. The canteen will be open from around 8am to facilitate this for you and you will need to give them your name as you will have to be marked off the list as being eligible due to sitting an exam that morning at 9am. A batch/wrap will be declined if your name is not on the list. Please take up this offer as it will be a good start to set you up for the day.

Please do not attend the canteen if it is just as your exam is about to start. We cannot allow you to be late for the exams so you need to ensure you get in college a bit earlier if needed to get this breakfast. Ideally before 8.30am.



Our Taster Days for new students starting in September 2023 are being held in college on Monday 26 June and Tuesday 27 June. Our current first years will not be on-site but will be expected to use this time to revise for their end of year exams which start on Monday 3 July 2023. Lessons in college will be back to normal on Wednesday 28 June.

If you have a sibling starting with us in September an email will be coming out to them this week about the Taster Days – please ask them to look out for it.

Employability and Careers

First years

Students are now using time in their progress sessions exploring their options for after college, all students have been encouraged to start a UCAS application in preparation for applying to University in the Autumn term. This is also a useful task to familiarise themselves with online applications if they are not applying to university.

Deadlines for UCAS applications are:

16th October 2023 deadline for Oxford, Cambridge, Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science. 31st January 2024 equal consideration deadline for all other courses.

Tuesday 20th June - University of Lincoln Medical School for any students interested in finding out more about studying medicine at University – students to collect the letter from the careers area and should be returned by Wednesday 14th June.

Wednesday 21st June 2.30pm - in college meeting for all students applying for Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science - room opposite Study Centre.

Thursday 14th September – Trip to Clare College Cambridge.

UCAT test for Medicine:

Students need to apply using this link https://www.gov.uk/student-finance-register-login, 19th May was the deadline for applying to ensure the funds are available for the start of term, but if you missed this deadline you should still apply.

UCAS Clearing:

From 5 July – 17 October 2023, you can apply for a course using Clearing if you're not already holding an offer from a university or college, and the course still has places.

You can use Clearing if:

- you're applying after 30 June
- you didn't receive any offers (or none you wanted to accept)

- you didn't meet the conditions of your offers
- you've paid the multiple choice application fee of £27
- you've declined your firm place using the 'decline my place' button in your application.

On results day on 17th August, there will be support from the careers team available in college.


