Absences

Please report all absences asap and preferably on the day. You should always report any absences to College Services even if you have advised your teachers. Please do this by telephone, email collegeservices@ke6n.ac.uk or Cedar (parent function).

An email will be sent home each day at 5pm to the student and the first contact on our system for any authorised and unauthorised absences for that day. If you have any query with that email, please contact college services.



Exams

The countdown to exams is now well and truly underway, with many of our students having already started taking exams in some areas. All students have been emailed their individual exam timetable and a copy can be found by them on Cedar (Cedar should be checked regularly as this has the most up to date seating information.

Important reminder

8th & 15th June – Afternoon

28th June - Full day

These dates will be used if a significant, unexpected event arises nationally or locally during the exam period such that no students (or a large number of them) are able to take an exam when planned. Of course, we all hope there won't be such disruption and that the contingency day won't be needed. Therefore, students should be available throughout the exam period, including these dates, in case their planned timetable is disrupted. The contingency date is set by Ofqual and the Joint Council for Qualifications. All students must be available for these dates.

Other dates:

- 3rd-7th July 1st year end of year exams
- 7th July Last day of term.

Be exam ready!

All students should come to college <u>fully equipped</u> for exams. Checking equipment the night before the exam is one of the easiest ways to avoid any last minute worries.

Students are expected to bring the following equipment:

- Pens (must be black ink for exams)
- Pencils
- Rules
- Scientific calculator (if applicable)
- Maths equipment (if applicable)
- College ID
- Pencil cases are <u>not permitted</u> unless they are transparent.

Breakfast Club – 9am exam starts only



We have arranged with the College canteen for students to obtain a free breakfast batch or wrap prior to 9am exams. The offer will be either a meat, vegetarian, halal or vegan option. The canteen will be open from around 8am to facilitate this for you and you will need to give them your name as you will have to be marked off the list as being eligible due to sitting an exam that morning at 9am. A batch/wrap will be declined if your name is not on the list. Please take up this offer as it will be a good start to set you up for the day.

Please do not attend the canteen if it is just as your exam is about to start. We cannot allow you to be late for the exams so you need to ensure you get in college a bit earlier if needed to get this breakfast. Ideally before 8.30am.



Student Parking and Car Park

In recent weeks, the college has received several complaints about inconsiderate parking in and around the college.

The college is aware that the student car park is often full.

The college cannot open-up the field for students to park on as this is used by our sports students and driving onto this area will damage the field. Access to the field is needed to ensure that the groundskeepers can work on the playing surfaces. It is also essential that access is given in case emergency services need to get onto the field.

Please do not block the entrance to the field, open the chain or drive onto the grassed area. Any student doing so will be disciplined accordingly.

Due to the current surface of the car park bays cannot be marked out and having the car park tarmacked is cost prohibitive at the moment.

We understand that driving to college maybe the most convenient form of transport for some students. If you do drive to college our advice would be:

- 1. Consider using public transport when possible.
- 2. If you are using the student car park, please arrive by 8.30am as it gets busy.
- 3. If the student car park is full make use of the public car parks in the town the cost is £1.50
- 4. Use Parkoedia: https://www.parkopedia.com to find a suitable car parking space.
- 5. Avoid parking in the nearby streets as these are permit only and Nuneaton has a high number of parking attendants who patrol regularly.
- 6. If you are using on street parking, then please be courteous to those that live nearby i.e. keep music down and ensure that you are parked legally.

Accepting UCAS offers:

Please check UCAS track for the deadline to accept your course. The majority of courses, if you applied by the 25th January, have until 18th May to make their offers to you, and then students will have until 8th June to accept their offers.

If you haven't received any offers you can apply through UCAS Extra for individual courses – Extra is open until 20th June.

Clearing:

From 5 July – 17 October 2023, you can apply for a course using Clearing if you're not already holding an offer from a university or college, and the course still has places.

You can use Clearing if:

- you're applying after 30 June
- you didn't receive any offers (or none you wanted to accept)
- you didn't meet the conditions of your offers
- you've paid the multiple-choice application fee of £27
- you've declined your firm place using the 'decline my place' button in your application.



Before the game began, KE6 led a tribute to former student Teal Mulvihill, and we thank Birmingham Met for taking part in a minute silence to remember him.

KE6 got the game underway and began the fixture with fantastic energy and enthusiasm. Some fine link up play between Lepmo Chemjong and Samuel Brito down the right flank was causing Birmingham some issues early on. Despite playing on a 4G pitch, KE6 were not shy of a challenge, with Aiden Lycett using his strength to show dominance in the middle of the park.
