Employability and Careers

Autumn 2022

Here is a quick update as to what we are offering in the careers team over the next term.

General information

The majority of the core careers programme is covered in progress sessions, to ensure that all students are receiving the necessary information they must attend their progress sessions.

All students can book one to one guidance with one of the careers advisors using the QR codes that are situated around college, they can choose an appointment that fits around their lessons. The appointments are 30 minutes long and can be followed up if necessary.

There are a number of skills links for students around employability and preparation for the workplace which include:

- What Employers want... CV writing, interview preparation, etc
- Presentation Skills
- Think about Oxford or Cambridge
- Science behind Medicine

In October all students were invited to attend our Autumn Careers and HE Fair, over 200 students attended either independently or as part of their lessons, our next fair will be in April/May date TBC.

We run drop in's every Tuesday and Thursday in the Careers area at break and lunchtime. Students don't need to make an appointment, they can pop along with any queries, have application forms checked, and we can help with preparation for interviews.

All students have been invited to attend an Apprenticeship Fair at the Coventry Arena on 8th November, the cost is £3 to cover travel - we still have a few places left.

All students will be asked to book a careers appointment the week beginning 5th or 12th December.

We have been working with students on the Social Sciences programme to plan work experience on a Friday between half term and Christmas, students should be following these applications up over half term. More information can be found on the teams group.

First vears

Second years

The 2023 UCAS applications are well underway. Students have received lots of support in getting their Personal Statements started and now need to work on these independently. Personal statement checking workshops will continue to be delivered by universities, students need to scan the QR code on posters in college to book onto a session, or book an appointment through the Employability and Careers sections students landing page or

Our internal deadline for UCAS applications is 25^{th} November, to give progress coaches time to check and process the application ready for the external application deadline of 25^{th} January.

Students should have attended University open days ready to help with making their choices, more information on these can be found on the university website or www.opendays.com

All students have access to <u>www.unifrog.org</u> a careers platform for researching careers, finding apprenticeships, sourcing universities and courses, there are quizzes, suggested extra reading linked to subjects and lots more.

If you are applying to the University of Birmingham have a look at this Access to Birmingham Scheme <u>Access to Birmingham (A2B) - University of Birmingham</u>

Birmingham City University attainment scholarship, Up-Grade.

This new scholarship awards students with a £1,000 payment where they exceed our published entry requirements. A couple of key points worth noting:

- Currently *only* available for 2023/24 entry
- Must be entering Year 1 (not Foundation Year)
- Must be main cycle
- Not available to students who already have their final grades (to emphasise the importance of attaining the best grades possible)

Students who have applied for Courses at Oxford and Cambridge will be offered interview preparation sessions on a Tuesday lunchtime on the following dates:

- Tuesday 1st November
- Tuesday 8th November Student led
- Tuesday 22nd November
- Tuesday 29th November

If students have applied for University of Cambridge they needed to submit "My Cambridge application" by 6pm 22nd October 2022, some students will also be required to submit some marked work from college.

Interviews will take place early December.

Students applying for Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary science will also be offered support ready for interview on the following dates:

- Thursday 24th November
- Thursday 1st December
- Thursday 8th December
- Thursday 15th December

We will continue this in the new year depending on interview dates.
