

On 22nd November we were excited to host another Employer Engagement networking breakfast in the impressive Unity Hub space. Our employer guests represented a good mix of sectors, and our curriculum leaders and progress leaders were eager to get feedback from the employers regarding what they find the skills gaps are when recruiting young people and to discuss what the emerging skills they are looking for. It was interesting to learn about the variety of career paths available within these companies and to discover what skills and qualities they are looking for when they recruit.





Overall it was a thoroughly useful morning and has given us the feedback we need to be able to work with our students to enhance their employability skills.





Guest Speaker: Stacey Cyber Security demonstration to IT students

training session for Year
12 students at KE6, which
supported their learning
and reinforced their
ability to answer exam
questions for their
external exam in IT.

Following on from recent employer feedback. Stacey put together a role play task which was designed to get the students thinking about how they should communicate professionally on the telephone. The students also took part in a hands-on activity that highlighted the importance of appropriate business dress where we got the students to have a go at getting our mannequin 'ready for work' and discussed what essential skills and attributes they need to demonstrate to potential employers. They even learned how to knot a tie - an essential life skill! In other tasks, students focussed on personal attributes required for specific job roles such as Network manager. During this lesson students also researched career pathways and investigated avenues such Higher Education and Apprenticeship routes. The feedback from the students was that this was a useful session that helped them to understand the importance of professional communication and taught them the essential transferrable skills that employers are looking for.



Trips




The 2nd year engineering students had a trip to the MIRA

Smoking & Vaping Policy

The college has a policy where vaping is permitted as long as it is within the designated area in the rear quad. Students are reminded not to vape in any other area within college. Although vaping is allowed in this area of college, smoking is not permitted anywhere on college site.

Recently classes have been disturbed due to students vaping and causing noise next to the Psychology classrooms. The college was also evacuated due to the fire alarms being set off due to vaping in toilets.

Why it's important to bring your Student ID Badge to college


£5.50 for a new Student ID Badge/Lanyard

- * Avoid queuing at reception to obtain a temporary pass No Impact on possibly being late for lesson
- * Taking ownership of something that you need for college as you'll need these skills when leaving here
 - * On your 3rd Borrowed Temporary Pass, an intervention will take place with a progress tutor/leader or college services leader
 - * If any further Passes are then borrowed, a charge of £3.50 will take place for every pass borrowed


The Finance office is now open everyday apart from Wednesday between 11am-1pm for student drop-ins.
