Our winners are:


1st Place - Nasrin Abubakar with a story called Future



# **Smoking & Vaping Policy**

The college has a policy where vaping is permitted as long as it is within the designated area in the rear quad. Students are reminded not to vape in any other area within college. Although vaping is allowed in this area of college, smoking is not permitted anywhere on college site.

Recently classes have been disturbed due to students vaping and causing noise next to the Psychology classrooms. The college was also evacuated due to the fire alarms being set off due to vaping in toilets.

# Why it's important to bring your Student ID Badge to college


£5.50 for a new Student ID Badge/Lanyard

- \* So everyone can recognise that you are a Student at King Edward VI College
- \* You need your pass as ID for exams
- \* To enable you to use the Lapsafe
- \* Relieving workload on the Reception Staff
- \* Access Lunches (Bursary)
- \* Borrow resources in college such as laptops/books/stationery
- \* Use of the Printers
- \* Avoid queuing at reception to obtain a temporary pass - No Impact on possibly being late for lesson
- \* Taking ownership of something that you need for college as you'll need these skills when leaving here
  - \* On your 3rd Borrowed Temporary Pass, an intervention will take place with a progress tutor/leader or college services leader
  - \* If any further Passes are then borrowed, a charge of £3.50 will take place for every pass borrowed

This will take effect from January 2024



# Bring your water bottle



We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that as an Eco-College we encourage sustainability and are unable to provide disposable cups for drinking water. Please do not request them from the canteen as they operate the same policy.

We would like to encourage all students to bring a reusable bottle to college. This can be re-filled at one of the many water points around the building. If you are struggling to obtain a re-usable bottle of your own, please let us know and we will try and help. We also provide reusable cups in the library for students to use.

### **Car Parking**

Please be aware that the student car park, located off

Attleborough Road, opens each college day at 8:00am and closes at 5pm. 
The Finance office is now open everyday between 11am-1pm, apart from Wednesday, for student drop-ins.
