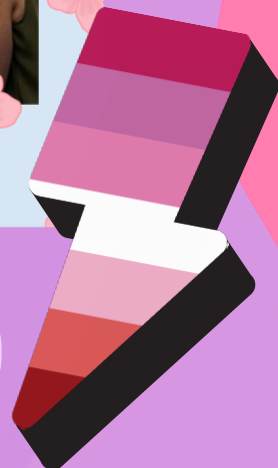
Some of our LGBTQIA+ students took part in a panel where staff and students could ask anything they wanted to know about the community. Thank you to everyone who shared stories/experiences!

16TH ANNUAL EDINBURGH TRIP!



The trip that has been running since 2008 is still wildly popular among the students and it shows! This is the 16th time our creative arts students have ventured from Nuneaton to Edinburgh, where the iconic *Trainspotting* was filmed, a film in which these students have studied year in, year out. The students explored the city on their own, and made some amazing memories, by visiting the historic areas as well as the art the city has to offer, whilst having a joint cinema trip with staff too. And as always, we can't wait for the next one to be a huge success like the rest!



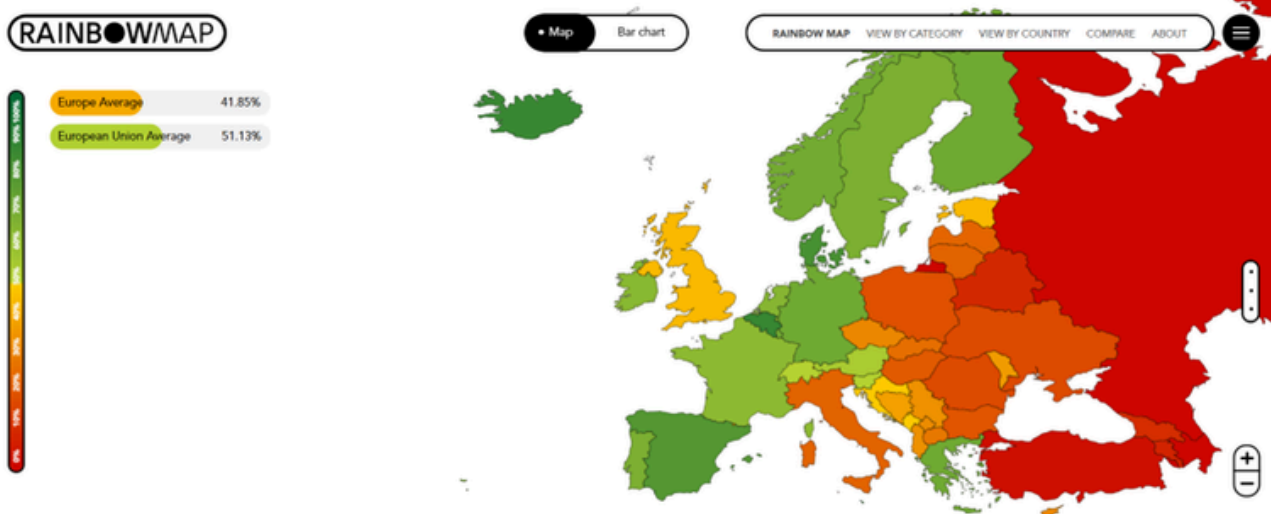
Year 12 visited Hartshill Hayes Country Park in June. Students were able to use their knowledge and theory from the classroom about the carbon cycle, and use fieldwork skills to estimate the amount of carbon stored in the woodland biomass. Unfortunately the visit coincided with one of the wettest days we've had in months - but the students responded well, considering how damp and soggy they got! Back in the classroom, students tested the hypothesis that there is a significant difference between carbon in different woodland areas. They demonstrated many skills including communication, teamwork, data collection, use of GIS, and plenty of resilience!

Geography Fieldwork



More Geography news...

For our final fieldwork day, students investigated how physically and mentally healthy Nuneaton town centre is. Whilst the economic health of high streets in recent years is well documented, but how can it benefit or negatively impact our health? By comparing the number of gyms/museums/health centres, to fast food/bookmakers/tanning salons, students could use the Richter Scale of Health to score. They conducted environmental quality surveys and an Index of Decay survey. Nuneaton's score was quite low and students were able to evaluate the methodology critically. This truly demonstrates how rapidly our high streets are changing and adapting to the current challenges faced. After 4 days of fieldwork Y12 students are now ready for their Geography NEA!



As part of Pride Month, we investigated how space and place can affect the LGBTQIA+ community across Europe. Using the Rainbow Map, students discussed what makes a place feel safe/unsafe, which led on to further discussions around recent changes in global politics and the use of social media. They followed this up by ranking a selection of European countries in order of the most socially and politically supportive countries to the least. Unsurprisingly, Russia ranked the lowest with a score of just 2%, but more surprisingly was Malta being at the top with 88%. The UK also scored quite low, at 45% - having dropped substantially in the last 10 years. Students then discussed how geographers can help to make spaces and places more inclusive, safe and visible for all people, and what challenges there might be in the future.

We'll be delivering winter aid (food packs, warm clothing, hygiene essentials) and providing wellbeing and empowerment support to women and children.

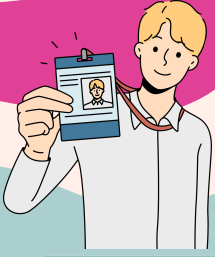
